Readings: Is 43:18-19, 21-22, 24b-25; 2 Cor 1:18-22; Mk 2:1-12

Dear Friends in Christ,

“Let’s go out to the desert!”

Not a very inviting suggestion, you might say. Yet that is what the gospel challenges us to do for the upcoming forty days of Lent.

Being in the year of Mark’s gospel in our Sunday cycle of liturgical readings, this is even more appropriate. This shortest and most sparse of the four New Testament gospels begins in the desert with the “voice crying aloud in the wilderness, ‘Prepare a way for the Lord; clear a straight path for him.’” (1:3). John the Baptist appears as this “voice” and “dressed in a rough coat of camel’s hair” (1:6). This sets a good tone for Lent: sparseness, no frills, a paring down of excess in our lives.

The major disciplines of Lent, fasting, prayer and works of charity, can take on a new meaning if our approach becomes “less is more”, as Mark does in composing his Gospel. Doing with less for ourselves so that we have more to give to God and others, and to grow ourselves into more faithful disciples.

I’d suggest a different kind of fasting to get in tune with the desert sparseness. How about a fast of TIME? If time seems to go too fast, it is usually because we are “fretting and fussing about so many things” (Luke 10:41). What unnecessary wastes of time can I fast from for forty days? Gossip? Mindless television programs? Internet use? Facebook? How much of saved time could I give to visiting the sick or volunteering at a worthwhile organization, helping a neighbor?

Or a fast of WORDS? There’s a great saying (I think it’s from Blessed John Henry Newman): “Say nothing that will not improve upon silence.” Value silence, not only in liturgy and prayer, but in daily conversations, in commenting on others’ behavior, appearance, etc. Only speaking when our words would add something positive or helpful to the situation would be a great exercise, and a great saver of time and energy, too.

These are just a couple of ideas for our Lenten observance. With some prayerful reflection on your own life circumstances, I’m sure you can come up with some personalized desert experience for the next forty days. These will be more useful, probably, than staying away from chocolate or a favorite dessert or beverage. Who knows, these disciplines may even last in our lives beyond the days of Lent, so we will truly rise to a new life with Christ on Easter and beyond.

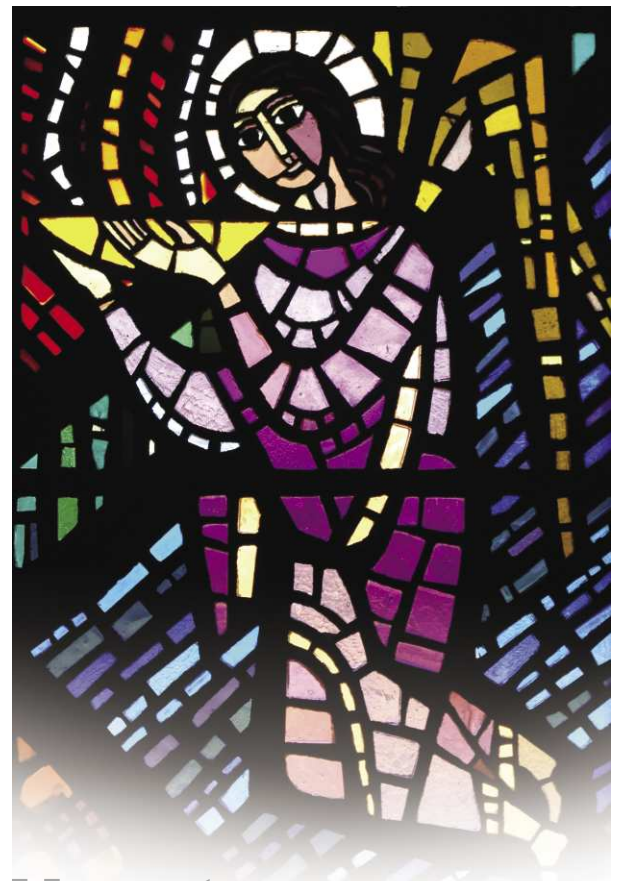
Faith, Family & Friends

MRI Results

Oh my dearest prayer warriors, what debt do I owe you? Our nine month post MRI scan came back clear!!! Words cannot express our gratitude and jubilation!

Everything went seamlessly today, from the moment Nathaniel's name was called to go to MRI triage to the amazing news that brought tears to our eyes! God is so, so kind to us.

A friend told me a few weeks ago that none of the AT/RT kids she has known in the last 4 years have ever made it to the nine month scan - couple that with the news Dr. Finlay relayed to us today and we are totally aware that YOUR prayers are why our son is alive. I know I say that a lot, so it may have lost some of its impact but believe me, it is really true. Although the good doctor has held us in good spirits throughout treatment, today he let us know that not once in his 30+ years of practice has he ever seen a metastasized AT/RT patient live; in most cases the relapse happens either during treatment or within the first six months post treatment. You can imagine our utter shock hearing that! He said it is still early, but Nathaniel is the first to make it this far. And who makes the impossible, possible? Who promises that what we ask, seek, and knock, we will receive? Your heartfelt, persistent prayers on behalf of our precious Nathaniel are altering the course of history, my friends!! Never doubt the effectiveness of your own prayers!

We also learned that Nathaniel is the first AT/RT patient to take maintenance chemo post treatment. And with this MRI, our boy is finished with treatment: August 4, 2010 – February 8, 2012. No more chemo - WOW!! It's been a long journey of up and downs and now we rely solely on the power of prayer to take us into the future. Modern medicine has done all it can for our boy. Thank God we have such prayer warriors on his side!!

There is so much more to say, but we are tired from the emotion of the day (and the days leading up to today). Suffice it to say, your prayers continue to effect a miracle, my friends. Lots and lots of love and a big huge hug! We are on our knees in gratitude for you and the mercy of God.
