THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Friends,

God's word speaks to those for whom life is often hopelessly dull. Through the character of Job, those who struggle with life's challenges are encouraged to be "upfront" and very frank when talking with God. Job was very blunt and his bitter rantings assure us that we don't have to hold back or "make nice" with God. He knows us better than we know ourselves.

However, like Job, we are encouraged not to wallow in our misery. Even though he lamented "ad nauseum" about his sufferings, Job eventually allowed God to lead him out of darkness and into a new day. Job's example reminds us that God has the power to make all things new (February 12).

Through the healing of Peter's mother-in-law (February 5), the leper (February 12), and the paralytic (February 19), we will be reminded that the word of God can be therapeutic. Each of these people whom Jesus cured were freed from their burden and called to live their lives more fully.

While most of us, like Peter's mother-in-law, have had a fever, few of us will be paralyzed, and even fewer will ever contract leprosy. However, we are stricken with any number of physical, psychological, emotional, spiritual, moral, and even economic ailments. Through all that we endure, we're not alone. In those times when we can't find our way even with God's healing word, God sends friends, relatives and strangers who, with their care and concern, bring us the help and healing we need. In the times when we are called to help others with their burdens, we find the strength and the grace to do so in the Word.

If we listen to the words of St. Paul and follow his ministry, we discover that whatever he did, when he chastised, when he challenged, whether he preached by word or by example, he did all for the glory of God. If we also make our decisions using that norm, the Gospel we preach would be truer and more easily recognized.

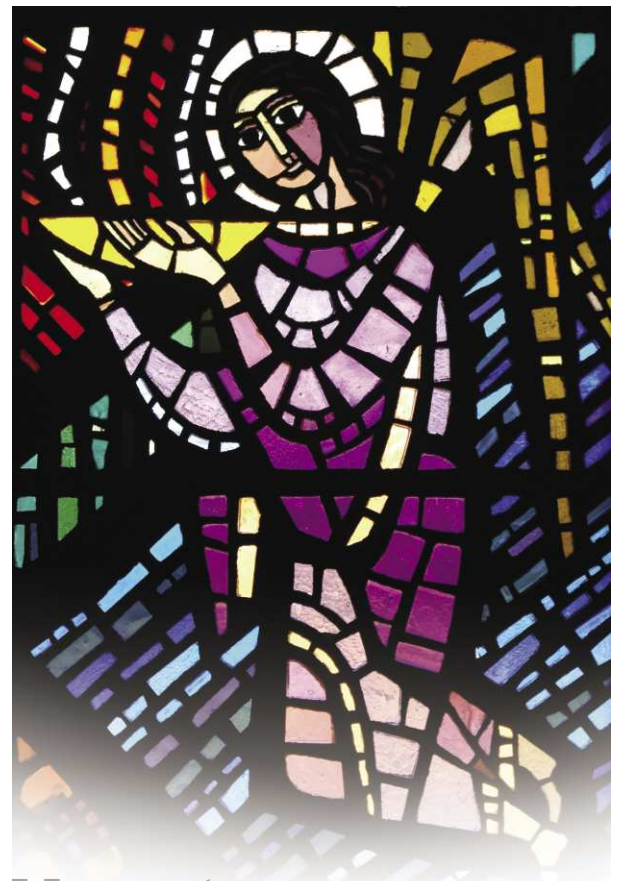
After the 6:00PM opening ceremonies, the children will attend their religious education classes. The adults will choose from the following topic areas:
