THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Friends,

These weeks of non-festive time are called "Sundays in Ordinary Time". First, because they derive not from a feast day (they used to be called Sundays "after Epiphany" or "after Pentecost"), but from the mystery of Jesus Christ. These Sundays, then, rather than celebrating a particular event, such as Christmas, Easter, or Pentecost, actually celebrate the whole mystery of Christ. Every Sunday is called a day celebrating the Lord's Day.

Second, they are called "Ordinary Time" because they are numbered (from the Latin word "ordinarius"). Although the Latin is translated in English as "ordinary," we mustn't think these Sundays are unimportant. In fact, they make up the longest liturgical season of the year. This is the time when Sunday after Sunday, we journey through a gospel with Jesus and learn what it means to be His followers, what it means to hear and heed His call, and we learn how to come to deeper relationship with Him.

While I'm on the topic of liturgy, I think it's important to recognize that all too often liturgies are flooded with words and more words. We've got to be careful that the words of liturgy are balanced with the ritual actions. This is especially true as we "work our way" through the new words of the new Roman Missal. It's not enough to simply respond during liturgy; it's not enough to put ourselves on "automatic pilot" during liturgy so that we stand when others stand, sit when others sit, respond when others respond, etc. Because liturgy is a communal celebration, it's too easy to let the others "carry us". Liturgy demands that we follow the ritual actions so that our words and deed show a true relationship with God and a commitment to grow that relationship.

The words and actions of liturgy can't remain only for the hour we spend at Mass on Sunday. Liturgy only really begins with the dismissal – if we've heard the words spoken with authority and internalized the actions of liturgy then our own integrity as members of the Body of Christ demands that we live as faithful disciples.

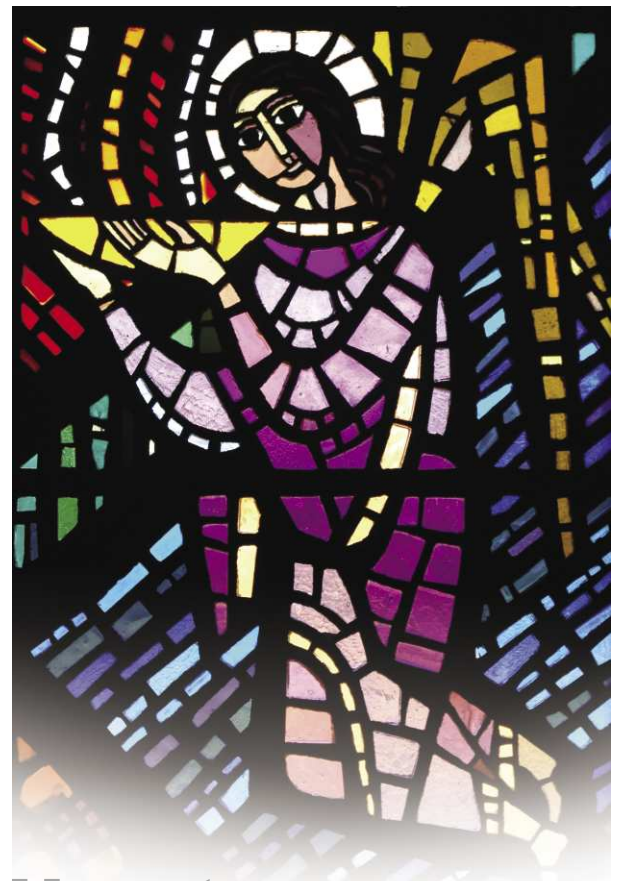
Faith, Family & Friends, our parish's faith formation & religious education program meets again this Tuesday, January 31 in Cardinal Newman Hall.
